

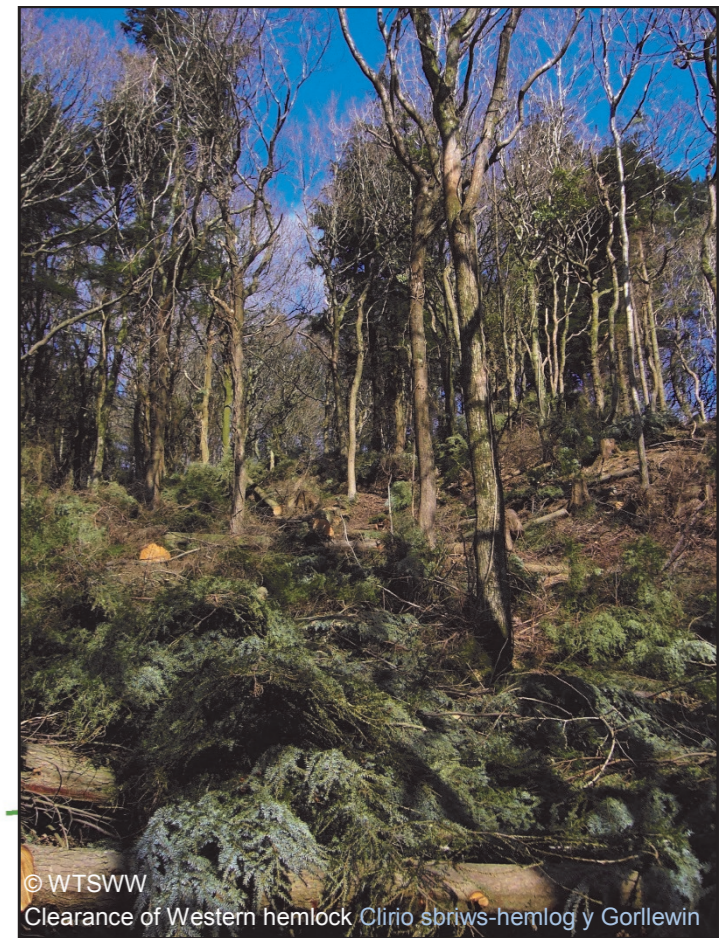

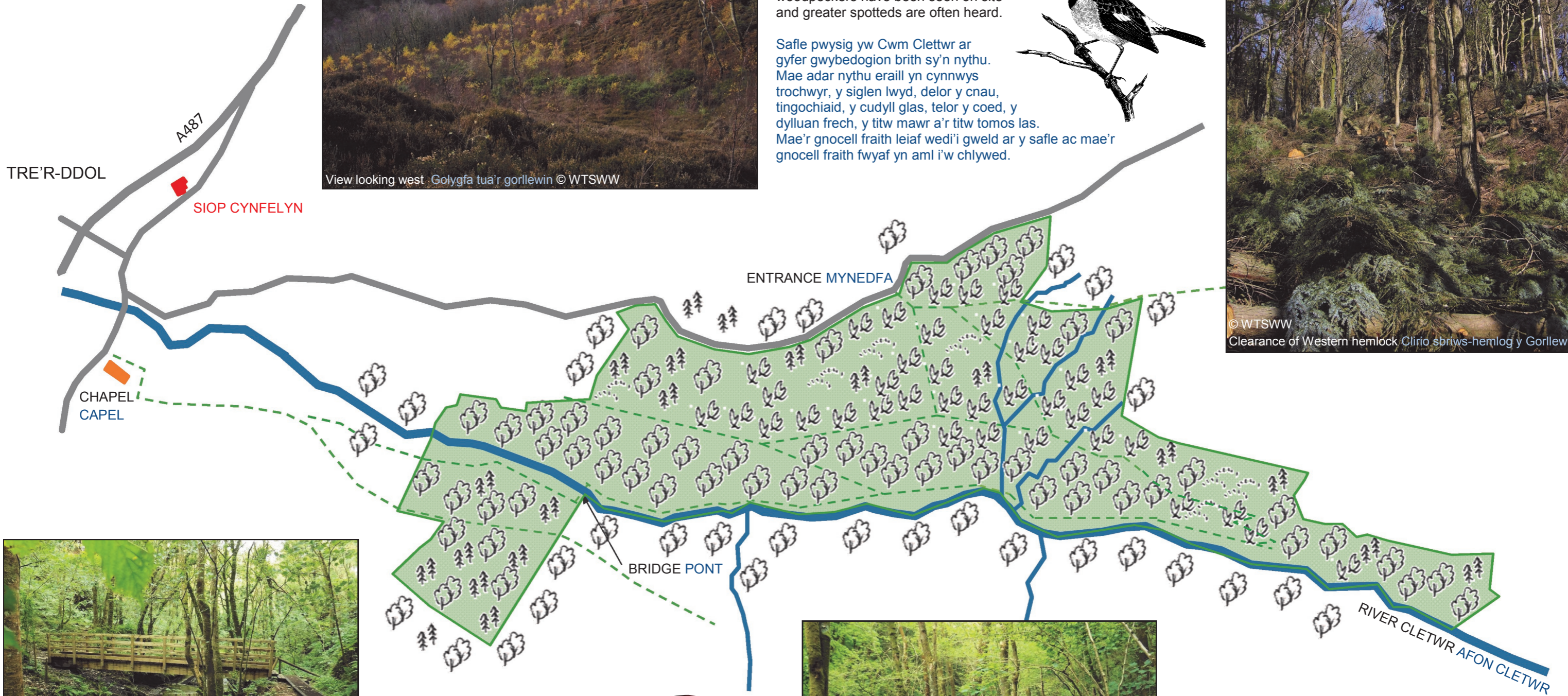
Cwm Clettwr is an important site for breeding pied flycatchers. Other breeding birds include dippers, grey wagtails, nuthatches, redstarts, sparrowhawks, wood warblers, tawny owls, great tits and blue tits. Lesser spotted woodpeckers have been seen on site and greater spotted are often heard.

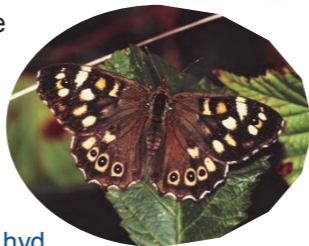
